- Our new Trust was created on 1 July 2018.
- We provide care to almost 1m people from eight sites and employ around 10,000 staff.
- Currently the biggest Trust in East Anglia.

- We set out a series of priority areas for improvement and report on our progress in the Quality Report each year.

 - care and treatment for patients with sepsis
 - care to those at the end of their life
 - access to psychiatric liaison services for hospital inpatients.



Quality Priority

- I'm going to focus on one of these priorities – improving end of life care.

Only one chance

- There is only one chance to get end of life care right.
- Our goal is having outstanding end of life care for all ESNEFT patients.



So what have we achieved this year?

- Opened the Time Garden at Colchester Hospital.
- Appointed a Trust lead for end of life care.
- Introduced 7 days a week specialist palliative care nursing.
- Set up Colchester and Ipswich Blanketeers providing knitted blankets for patients.



Making a difference every day

- Thank you to more than 700 volunteers who work across Trust services.
- More than 6,650 hours a month are given to the Trust.
